Minutes of the Annual Meeting: May 5, 2024

Moderator John Andrews called the meeting to order at 10:37.

Trey Posey led a prayer. John asked for a moment of silence in memory of members who left us this year: Doris Silvia, Donna Chellis, Bucky Caswell and Fred Yole.

Motioned/seconded to accept the Annual Meeting reports, exclusive of budget and nominating committee reports. No discussion. Motion approved by unanimous vote. John conveyed special thanks to the Deacons, who took on additional responsibilities this past year in the absence of a pastor.

Pastor Search Committee Chair Jill Dolce reported on a meeting hosted by Abcori for churches in search of part-time pastors. The outlook is not promising: there is a scarcity of individuals looking for part-time positions. Jill reported that of the five churches in attendance, CBC seemed to be the most open to partnering with another church. Other churches were looking for (and had budgets for) two/thirds-time pastors. Additional options discussed were using trained lay-leaders to deliver sermons; or becoming a "satellite church" that organizes its own worship service while screening sermons provided by an external church or individual. The Search Committee has revised the job description to encompass alternative pathways.

Motioned/seconded to accept the budget report. Board of Directors Chair Rob Taylor shared that the budget is balanced and includes funds to pay a competitive salary for a part-time pastor. While plate numbers and gift numbers are down, additional funds were raised by the Artisans/Christmas Fair and the recent Indoor Yard Sale. Motion approved by unanimous vote.

Motioned/seconded to accept the Nominating Committee report. No discussion. Motion approved by unanimous vote.

Motioned/seconded to adjourn the meeting at 10:54. No discussion. Motion approved by unanimous vote.

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### Pastoral & Staff Relations Committee Annual Report

The Pastoral Relations Committee is made up of three members who meet periodically with the pastor. We serve as an advisory group to the pastor as well as the staff at CBC, bringing any concerns to them that may arise.

#### Our duties include:

- 1. Providing a communication link between the pastor and the congregation.
- 2. Helping the pastor, staff and congregation deal with conflict.
- 3. Monitoring the evaluation process for pastor and staff
- 4. Reviewing the pastor's compensation package and making recommendations to the Board of Trustees
- 5. Reviewing the pastor's employment contract.
- 6. Understanding the role of ministry

This year (2023-2024) we found ourselves without a pastor for the year leaving us with a lighter workload. Our staff at CBC has all stepped up and report feeling well supported by the congregation during this time of transition. Tammy took the responsibility of providing pulpit supply. We seem to have a good pool to work with. The Deacons were able to secure Sandra D'Amico for pastoral care and emergencies.

### Moderator's Annual Report

The duties of the Moderator include presiding over all official meetings of the church and serving as chair of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee comprises the Moderator, the Church Clerk, and one representative each from the Boards of Trustees, Deacons and Christian Education with the Pastor serving as an ex-officio member.

A key concern for the Executive Committee and the Congregation this year has been the absence of, and search for, a settled Pastor. The Pastoral Search Committee is seeking candidates for a part time pastorate, so far without success as such candidates are currently scarce and in great demand.

The absence of a new settled Pastor allows us an opportunity to relearn how to manage ourselves as a congregation while that search continues. A number of individuals, with and without recognized formal leadership roles, have stepped up with exceptional initiative and devotion to meet CBC's needs in pastoral care, pulpit supply, fundraising activities, and other leadership tasks. A series of four well-attended congregational forums has allowed us all to engage our shared thoughts, ideas, plans, and aspirations for CBC during this time. These volunteer efforts and lively conversations warmly testify to the vigor and vitality of this community of faith.

Two other noteworthy developments also occurred this year. After much hard work, the kitchen renovation has finally resulted in commercial certification, opening many possibilities and a new revenue source for CBC. Also, the years-overdue review and revision of our Constitution was finally accomplished and ratified by the Congregation in a special meeting in December.

New issues, including policies will be shared at the Annual Meeting on May 5, 2024.
